SPECIAL CHARACTER - statement

The special character of Newton Central Primary School is based on the relationships between tangata whenua and tangata Tiriti which were envisioned by Te Tiriti o Waitangi, in the belief that this will provide an effective framework for the best possible educational outcomes for all. This includes, but is not limited to,

- . renormalising use of te reo me ona tikanga
- being culturally inclusive
- promoting equity

SPECIAL CHARACTER – key features

- In future, all whanau coming to the school would need to commit to the special character
 - As would new kaimahi
- We would not have a zone; so anyone would be eligible who shared the philosophy
 - But we would have to negotiate a maximum enrolment with the Ministry
 - So we would need priorities in case more wanted to come than we have space for
- Being recognised by the Ministry as having special character does not affect Ministry funding
- Schools with religious foundation, Montessori, etc are 'special character' (as are kura kaupapa Maori but under a different provision)
