Te Uru Karaka Newton Central School is preparing to open for instruction on Tuesday 30th January. We have kick started our year with the arrival of new furniture for 4 of our classrooms. We had Rūma 16/17 and the office recarpeted and Siteworks drained and fixed 26 cess pits that were causing significant issues for our kura. We have had our kaiako come to set up their classrooms and participate in professional learning for Structured Literacy and Numeracy.

This year will see the beginning of our new strategic direction for the school. Our key focus will be on growing consistency across the kura and developing our curriculum implementation, starting with literacy. Change management is a long process so our kaiako will begin professional learning around the pedagogical approach to literacy. Our reporting and assessment practice will remain unchanged initially, and as our team's understanding strengthens you'll see some changes in the later part of the school year, with a reworking of our assessment and reporting for 2025.

The Ministry of Education has given every school in Aotearoa 2 teacher only days around curriculum development which we do not have to make up which means our **closing date** for the school year will now be: **Friday 13th December 2024**.

First Day Powhiri


Graduate Profile

Ngā Pou Manawatahi

The principles that bind us



Whanaungatanga

A learner whose sense of belonging and connectedness enables them to cultivate positive relationships through their words and actions.

Manaakitanga

A learner who demonstrates kindness and empathy, and participates in acts of service and altuism.

Rangatiratanga

A learner who is confident in their identity, who has a strong sense of agency, and understands how they can best contribute to their own and others' learning.

Kaitiakitanga

A learner who is respectful of self, others and the environment and who actively contributes to a better world for now and for future generations.
