2024 Enrolments

Each year the Board of Trustees will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year (if any) for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

In-Zone (Home Zone)

Out of Zone

Applications are now open. They close at 3pm on Wednesday 11th October 2023.

Each Priority has a separate online Pre-Enrolment Form to complete at https://www.newton.school.nz/out-of-zone/

First Priority:

1. Te Whānau Rumaki o Te Uru Karaka – Level 1 Total Immersion Years 0 – 6;

2. Te Whānau Awahou - Level 1 & 2 Immersion Years 0 - 6;

Second Priority: Must be given to any applicant who is the sibling of current students.

Third Priority: Must be given to any applicant who is the sibling of past students of Newton Central School.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status will be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.

Fourth Priority: Must be given to any applicant who is the child of a former student.

Fifth Priority: Must be given to any applicant who is the child of an employee, or member, of the board of trustees.

Sixth Priority: Due to high enrolments of in-zone students, there will be no Category 6 (Sixth Priority) enrolments or ballots available in 2024.

REMINDERS:

- Term 4 is a sunhat term. School caps can be purchased at the office (\$25 for children and \$32 for adults).
- There are lots of sniffles about. If you are able to, please bring in a box of tissues and drop them to the classroom teacher.
- If your child is absent for 3 days or more the school requires a medical certificate or email explaining their time away (this is for audit purposes).
