## **COVID** isolation rules removed

You will have seen that the mandatory COVID isolation rules have been removed by the Government and endorsed by The Ministry of Education and the Regional District Health Boards. This took effect on 15th August 2023. The risk of COVID-19 is now considered low compared to other stages of the pandemic.

#### What does this mean for us?

As with any other illness it is recommended that students and staff stay at home if they are feeling unwell, and should follow Ministry of Health guidelines in order to stop the spread of illness and keep others safe. At Newton Central School we will continue to:

- Keep learning spaces and group gatherings well ventilated.
- Encourage mask wearing.
- Continue with our hand washing/sanitising practice.
- Teach our tamariki to "catch a cough" and "blow the nose."
- We will send students home if they are displaying symptoms of illness.
